Non-US Citizens

Non-US Citizens may need a visa in addition to a residence permit to study in Denmark.

New Program

This program will be offered by UCEAP for the first time in Summer 2019. The Program Guide mentioned above should be available a few months before the program start date.

Students attending the UCEAP Denmark Univ. of Copenhagen program are able to take one course at the Copenhagen Business School through an agreement with Copenhagen University and applied it to their EAP study list. Students have often taken advantage of this option and enjoyed the courses there.

Students Must Meet the GPA Requirement of 2.85 cumulative GPA at time of application

Applicants who need GPA Waivers will not be considered.
